BROMLEY SKI RACE CLUB CODE OF CONDUCT

In order for all members of Bromley Ski Race Club to learn new skills and to improve themselves in a safe, fun and encouraging environment, it is essential that certain rules are recognised and followed. These rules apply not only at Chatham Ski Slope, but also at all other venues where our members are training or racing. Individuals should familiarise themselves with rules that are specific to other slopes.

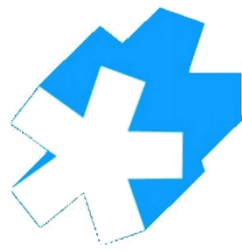
It is expected that all coaches, members, parents and guests of Bromley Ski Race Club

- Set a positive example for others, particularly young members and supporters
- Treat everyone equally and not discriminate on the grounds of age, ability or disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, socioeconomic status, sex or sexual orientation
- Not condone or allow to go unchallenged any form of discrimination or bullying if witnessed
- Display high standards of behavior
- Encourage all participants to learn the laws and rules of ski racing and act within them
- Promote the positive aspects of snowsport and fair play
- Recognise good performance and not just race results
- Place the well-being and safety of each racer above all other considerations including the development of performance (Coaches)
- Ensure that activities are appropriate for the age, maturity, experience and ability of the individual (Coaches)
- Respect and follow the instructions of all ski coaches, instructors, Chatham ski slope management and the committee of Bromley Ski Race Club
- Respect all lift safety regulations including those relating to lift queues
- Ensure ski preparation (excess wax removal) is done in appropriate place and all rubbish removed or binned
- Remember that skis, boot bags, clothing, etc. are to be stored tidily and safely and remain the responsibility of the owner
- Disclose to their coach any medical condition that may affect any first aid situation (Racers)
- Use the internet appropriately and not use the internet, phone or other electronic device to make derogatory remarks about other competitors, teams, officials, clubs or anything related to snowsport that could bring the sport into disrepute
- Report any safeguarding concerns to the Club Welfare Officer.

The following examples of misconduct may result in disciplinary action or withdrawal of the racer's membership

- Disrespect or rudeness to any race official, coach, committee member or ski area employee by the Racer or the parent/guardian of the Racer
- Demonstrations of un-sportsmanlike conduct (e.g. throwing ski poles, muttering profanities...) arguing, fighting, bullying, discrimination of other racers or the use of foul language on or off the slope
- Smoking, being under the influence of alcohol or the use of any illegal substance whilst skiing or training
- Theft, vandalism or willful damage to any private or public property

EVERY racer is part of a TEAM - TEAM ATTITUDE should be one of ENCOURAGEMENT

BROMLEY SKI RACE CLUB CODE OF CONDUCT (Junior Members)

It is expected that all Junior members

- Show respect and courtesy to other snowsport participants at all times
- Show respect and courtesy to coaches and officials at all times.
- Respect the rules at all slopes visited
- Be generous when you win and gracious when you lose
- Always accept the decisions of officials and never argue
- Work hard for themselves and the good of the team
- Co-operate with their coach, team-mates and opponents
- Be a good role model and never use inappropriate (bad) language or gestures
- Not bully or condone bullying of any kind – physical, mental or verbal (name calling)
- Not push in on lift queues – always take their place in line
- Never raise their poles in anger or frustration or at another racer
- Look after their equipment and make sure it is stored safely and tidily
- Remember to clear up after themselves and remove all rubbish or put it in the bin
- Not use the internet, phone or other electronic device to make remarks about other people involved in snowsport, or clubs, or anything related to snowsport that could be considered wrong or unkind
- Report any concerns they have to their coach, Club Welfare Officer or their parents

EVERY racer is part of a TEAM - TEAM ATTITUDE should be one of ENCOURAGEMENT
